A Message from IDOT Concerning COVID-19

The Illinois Department of Transportation is taking several steps to help prevent the spread of COVID-19, in keeping with our commitment to protect the health and safety of the public and our employees.

We take this obligation very seriously.

At IDOT, under the leadership of Gov. JB Pritzker, the agency will continue to focus on keeping infrastructure in safe and in good condition.

We remain open for business at this time with a special focus on our critical mission of maintaining a safe, reliable system of transportation for Illinois. Our roads and bridges are open and will stay open. Maintenance and operations staff remain on duty throughout the state, as usual, with the No. 1 goal again of providing safe, reliable transportation for all users.

Likewise, our rest areas remain open 24/7. Now, more than ever, this is a vital resource for motorists, truckers and other travelers in Illinois. The janitorial crews are diligently and frequently cleaning and disinfecting each facility. A few occasionally will be closed because of construction or maintenance issues. If we do have to close a building, the parking lots will remain open. We also are asking for a favor: Please dispose of your trash properly. Your cooperation to help keep rest areas as clean and safe as possible is much appreciated.

There are no plans to stop or suspend construction because of this health crisis. Workers who support the construction of critical or strategic infrastructure are considered essential by the Department of Homeland Security and have a special responsibility to maintain a normal work schedule. With our partners in industry, we will strive to keep this construction season on schedule.

Public meetings in a shared space have been postponed until further notice and are being transitioned when possible to online platforms.

 - A: While overall traffic volumes are still down compared to 2019, they are increasing as we move through the phases of Restore Illinois.

- · Q: When traveling, what are some key travel tips to follow?
 - A: To minimize your possible exposure to the coronavirus while traveling, you are advised to maintain social distance from others you encounter, wear a mask or other face covering, limit your touching of surfaces and wash your hands immediately when you have returned home or somewhere with soap and water. • Q: What is the status of the Adopt-A-Highway program?

A: Adopt-A-Highway groups may resume cleanup activities with additional guidelines in place to help
prevent the spread of COVID-19. While normal program activities are resuming, Adopt-A-Highway
groups are not obligated to clean their adopted section at this time. For more information on the

Q: Has IDOT made any changes in the process to get a permit to pull overweight and oversize loads?

• A: The waiver on overweight and oversize loads expired May 29. Normal permitting and restrictions are in place.

• Q: What is the status of Amtrak state-supported trains?

 A: Effective Monday, June 29, the Hiawatha Service between Chicago and Milwaukee will run four round trips a day. Despite a reduction in frequencies, state-supported Amtrak trains are still running downstate and providing an essential mode of transportation. The state-supported downstate routes are Lincoln Service, Illini/Saluki and Illinois Zephyr/Carl Sandburg. More details can be found at www.Amtrak.com (https://www.Amtrak.com)

• Q: Are Illinois weigh stations still open and are trucks required to stop?

• A: Yes, all weigh stations are open. Trucks are required to stop.
