Natalie Gallo is currently a Senior student at the University of the District of Columbia, and she will be graduating in May 2021. She is a proud Latina, and she strives to always break stereotypes in the civil



engineering field. This summer, she will begin her first geotechnical engineering job in Maryland, and she hopes to become a professional engineer in the near future.

In her essay, Natalie highlighted: "The understanding of the geotechnical field excites me whether I choose to design the next Hoover Dam or test Mars soil samples for future exploration. I have always envisioned my civil engineering career out in the field where no two days are the same and the challenges and difficulties of the geotechnical field are what gravitated me to want to pursue this career. The only negative aspect of the geotechnical engineering field is the lack of Hispanic and female diversity. Naturally, this negative aspect only motivates and encourages me to break through." ■
